

CURRICULUM SUMMARY SHEET MINOR IN EDUCATIONAL STUDIES

The intent of the **Minor in Educational Studies** is to introduce students to education at the Childhood level (grades 1-6) or Adolescent level (grades 7-12), either because they eventually want to pursue a career in teaching or because they have an interest in education but do not want to pursue teaching as a career. Wagner students with the minor in educational studies, a major in one of the prescribed disciplines and the requisite GPA are eligible to complete an accelerated Master's degree in Childhood Education or Adolescent Education. Upon completion of the graduate program, students qualify for college recommendation initial and professional New York State certification in Childhood 1-6/ Students with Disabilities or Adolescent 7-12/ Students with Disabilities and content area.

Note for 7-12: Please come early in your undergraduate program for advisement to ensure your major courses all meet program standards.
