

Wagner College Pre-College Program for High School Students

Wagner College wants to help you get a jumpstart on your college education. This initiative caters to expanding your educational and cultural horizons in a real life college setting. With several classes to choose from, each program is taught by leading Wagner faculty and designed to help students tackle real problems, make a difference and learn what it takes to be a leader. For the Spring 2018 semester, there are three college course available to local high school students on the recommendation of your College Guidance Advisor. Eligibility

We are currently accepting applications from diverse, bright and dedicated students who meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be high school juniors or seniors (or sophomores for MU 050A.)
- Applicants must be recommended by their high school college advisor or band director.
- Students must submit a fully completed application signed by a parent or guardian to the program along with the \$50 registration fee per course.

Application materials are due by Tuesday, January 2, 2018.

FAQ

Do students receive college credit for participating in the program?

Yes, each program offers the opportunity to earn college credit. Each of the academic programs will grant 1 unit* per course or the equivalent of 3-4 credits per course that are generally transferrable at similar colleges. (*MU 050A grants $\frac{1}{2}$ unit.)

Where will courses be held?

All classes are held at Wagner College.

How much does each class cost?

The cost of each course is \$500 (\$250 for MU 050A.) There will be an additional \$50 nonrefundable registration fee per course that must accompany the application. Students are also responsible for the purchase of any materials and/or textbooks required for each course. All tuition must be paid in full by January 12, 2018.

Wagner College Grading System and Transcripts

Grading will be based on the College's grading system, which can be found on page 73 of the Wagner College Undergraduate/Graduate Bulletin. Students will adhere to all Wagner College academic policies and procedures. Students will receive an official Wagner College transcript upon successful completion of their course(s). Students who matriculate at Wagner College will receive "advance standing" for courses they passed while participating in the program.

Students who ultimately decide to attend another institution should be aware that courses completed with a grade of "C" or higher are generally accepted for transfer credit, but Wagner College makes no guarantee as to transfer eligibility.



CH 291: Forensic Chemistry: Crime Scene Investigation

This course focuses on the scientific methods employed by forensic chemists for crime scene investigation. Topics covered will include physical evidence recognition and collection, DNA and fingerprint analysis, toxicology, sample preservation, and crime scene reconstruction. Study of the basic theories and laws of chemistry will be introduced.

TH 106: Introduction to Acting

This course provides a basic orientation to the dynamics of acting within a supportive studio environment including acting exercises, theatre games and improvisation. Scenes and monologues will be chosen from contemporary plays.

MU 050A: College Band

The Wagner College Concert Band is a 40- to 60-piece symphonic wind and percussion ensemble comprising of college students, advanced high school students and adult community members. Typical music repertoire includes contemporary concert works, classical transcriptions, Broadway show tunes, and patriotic marches. The group performs several concerts each year, both on and off campus. Enrollment is open to wind and percussion instrumentalists with prior experience in high school band.

January 22 to May 7, 2018

Mondays, 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Pre-college high school students must audition in advance of the first class.

Audition Format

Performance of one prepared selection before music faculty, performance of a scale on demand to be selected by adjudicator and assessment of sight reading ability.

What to Prepare


Prepare one musical selection in any style to demonstrate ability and talent (length of selection is not critical). Memorization is not required. Please bring a copy of your selected piece with you.

What to Bring

- Your instrument. (Tuba, baritone sax and percussion will be provided. Percussion students should bring their own drumsticks and/or mallets.)
- Completed Application Form.
- Completed Band Director/Music Teacher Recommendation Form.
