ACT Advanced Performing Arts (Ages 7 to 9)

They will go back to the silent screen and Charlie Chaplin to learn pantomime. Musical performance stars such as Streisand and Bennet will be explored as well. Students will learn about scene study, character analysis, and how to break down a song to perform. The ACT program at Wagner College continually receives high praises in all program categories from parents and young actors. Give your child the opportunity to explore his/her inner self and express ideas through the art of drama. There are a variety of classes for aspiring actors of all ages with an opportunity to be cast in our annual musical production on the Wagner College Main Stage.

ACT Musical Theatre (Ages 10+)

Our 10 month "triple-threat" theatre program and school for children and teens begins every September and encompasses acting, musical performance, and movement. Actors focus on building confidence while performing improvisations, character studies, and theater games and learning about theatre production, stage management, auditioning and directing. Now in our 12th year, ACT continues to train our young people in the art of the theatre while expanding into an acting school to meet the needs of actors of all ages and talent levels.

Only those students enrolled in the full year program in September are eligible to audition for our spring 2019 main stage musical production. Students not cast in a lead role will continue their theatre workshop classes, learning and improving upon their triple-threat skills and joining the cast in an ensemble performance on the Wagner stage.
