

'Chorus Line' in full swing at Wagner College

It's the record-breaking "musical for everyone who has ever put it all on the line in pursuit of their dreams."

Doesn't ring a bell?

Well, how about these enduring tune titles: "What I Did For Love," "One," "Let Me Dance For You," I Hope I Get It," "At the Ballet" and "Dance: 10, Looks: 3" (aka the "T&A Song").

That's right, the enduring, singular sensation that is "A Chorus Line" high-kicked its way onto the acclaimed Wagner College Main Stage Wednesday night.

Tony Award-winner and legit Broadway veteran Michele Pawk helms the Pulitzer Prize-winning musical through April 24 in Grymes Hill.

From the original program notes: "The characters portrayed in 'A Chorus Line' are, for the most part, based upon the lives of Broadway dancers. This show is dedicated to anyone who has ever danced in a chorus or marched in step ... anywhere."

Following an off-Broadway run at the Public Theater, "A Chorus Line" opened on July 25, 1975, at Broadway's Shubert Theatre, where it played a record-breaking 6,137 performance run.

The original Broadway cast included Donna McKechnie (who, btw, is appearing in Harbor Lights Theatre Co.'s upcoming "Show Stoppers" at the Music Hall), Kelly Bishop, Priscilla Lopez, Thommie Walsh, Baayork Lee, Wayne Cilento, Sammy Williams, and Robert LuPone. Among the 10 Tonys the show won in 1976, McKechnie, Bishop and Williams took home acting honors.

Conceived and originally directed and choreographed by Michael Bennett ("Dreamgirls"), the show's book is by James Kirkwood and Nicholas Dante, with music by Marvin Hamlisch and lyrics by Edward Kleban. The original New York production was co-choreographed by Bob Avian.
