Wagner-CSI game puts focus on education

When the College of Staten Island heads over to Wagner College tomorrow night for a 7 o'clock game, it will mark the second year in a row the Island schools have met in basketball following a 16-year series intermission.

It will also be "30,000 Degrees Night," an event meant to make Islanders more aware of a college readiness partnership among the three borough colleges (CSI, Wagner and St. John's) and local schools.

The purpose of the collaboration is to encourage the idea of education in Island kids who might not ordinarily consider going on to college.

They are given access to college labs, workshops and on-campus courses.

Part of the strategy is to familiarize Islanders with the next step so that once they begin life as a college student they do so with a foundation that will give them a better chance to succeed.
