Suave song stylist Charlie Romo headlines at Metropolitan Room

Charlie Romo, the Tottenville crowd-pleaser formerly known as Charlie Poveromo,

is hitting the big time.

The smooth-sounding crooner headlines Friday at The Metropolitan Room, the hot spot described by Zagat's as a Flatiron "class act" reviving the "golden age of cabaret" as "up-and-coming stars" and "renowned performers" take the stage in an "intimate" room with "great acoustics."

In the past year alone, he has appeared on stages with Usher, Lee Roy Reams, Chita Rivera and Ben Vereen at The Friars Club and other city venues.

"Believe me when I tell you that I'm so grateful for these opportunities and I sometimes can't contain my excitement," says Romo, a junior at Wagner College, where he's a music and education major.


Making his upcoming Manhattan gig even more special: It will be Charlie's 21st birthday show.

The Metro show also feature vocalists Michelle DellaFave and Marissa Mulder.

Romo will be backed by the Barry Levitt Quartet, a group of world-class musicians with names like Ronnie Zito, a drummer for Bobby Darin; Jon Burr, bassist for Tony Bennett; and Jack Cavari, a guitarist for Frank Sinatra. Levitt himself has worked with dozens of top artists, including Eartha Kitt, Judy Collins and Ben Vereen at the Copacabana when live supper clubs were in their heyday.

As a toddler, Romo says he developed a passion for the American Song Book — Darin was his favorite singer - and popular standards from the 1950s and '60s.

Today, he relishes reviving the musical style and sophistication of a previous era in a "dynamic and refreshing way."




