The annual observance of Italian Heritage Month is set for Wednesday, Sept. 27, at 6 p.m., and it's not too early to reserve a seat.


Chairing the event is **Eleanor Conforti**, former chairwoman of Community School Board 31 and a Staten Island Advance Woman of Achievement.

## THE HONOREES

Former Borough President Lamberti served from 1984 to 1990. Upon his departure from Borough Hall, he was appointed executive vice president of Staten Island University Hospital for 15 years before retiring in 2005.

Lamberti is past chairman of the Staten Island United Way and the Wagner College Da Vinci Society, founder of the annual Harmony Street Fair and chairman emeritus of the Snug Harbor Cultural Center and Botanical Garden. He is a former member of the board of the American Red Cross. Aid for Retarded Children, Visiting Nurses Association, the Heart Foundation, the Alzheimer's Association and the American Parkinson's

Disease Foundation.

He and his wife, Susan, live in West Brighton and have four children and four grandchildren.

Dr. Carpenito is executive vice president and chairman of the Richmond University Medical Center's Anesthesia Department and a vital part of the hospital since 1985. He served on its finance, strategic planning and joint conference committees and is responsible for supervising 22 anesthesiologists. He is a member of the New York State Society of Anesthesia, the Richmond County Medical Society and the American Medical Association. Dr. Carpenito served as chairman of St. Vincent's Annual Charity Ball from 2000 to 2004. He received the 2008 **RUMC Medical Staff Dinner** Physician Leader Award, the United Hospital Fund's Distinguished Trustee Award and, in 2005, he was named honoree for the St. Vincent's Charity Ball.
