Wagner College Theatre kicks off its 50th Anniversary Season with a staged reading of GAMERS, a new play written by WCT alum Scott Barnhardt '01, on Sunday, January 21 at 5:00pm at the Stage One Studio Theater. Admission is free.

"Gamers is the theatrical love-child of The Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt and American Buffalo," says playwright Barnhardt. "The dogeat-dog world of eSports is not known for its sweetness. But when Paul Elliot Anderson - the world's most optimistic orphan, from Somewhere, Ohio - is recruited to the hypercompetitive video gamer workhouse of Harrington Media ... game over."

Scott Barnhardt (Playwright) A native of Southern California, Scott is currently the Director of Musical Theatre at Orange County School of the Arts, where he graduated from in 1997. He earned his BA in Theater/Speech from Wagner College and received his MFA in Playwriting from University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). His acting credits include the original Broadway cast of The Book of Mormon (Elder Harris/Elder Thomas, u/s Elder McKinley, Asst. Dance Captain) and the Deaf West Broadway Revival of Big River at Roundabout Theater Company. Other NYC: Yank!
