'Truth on Display'

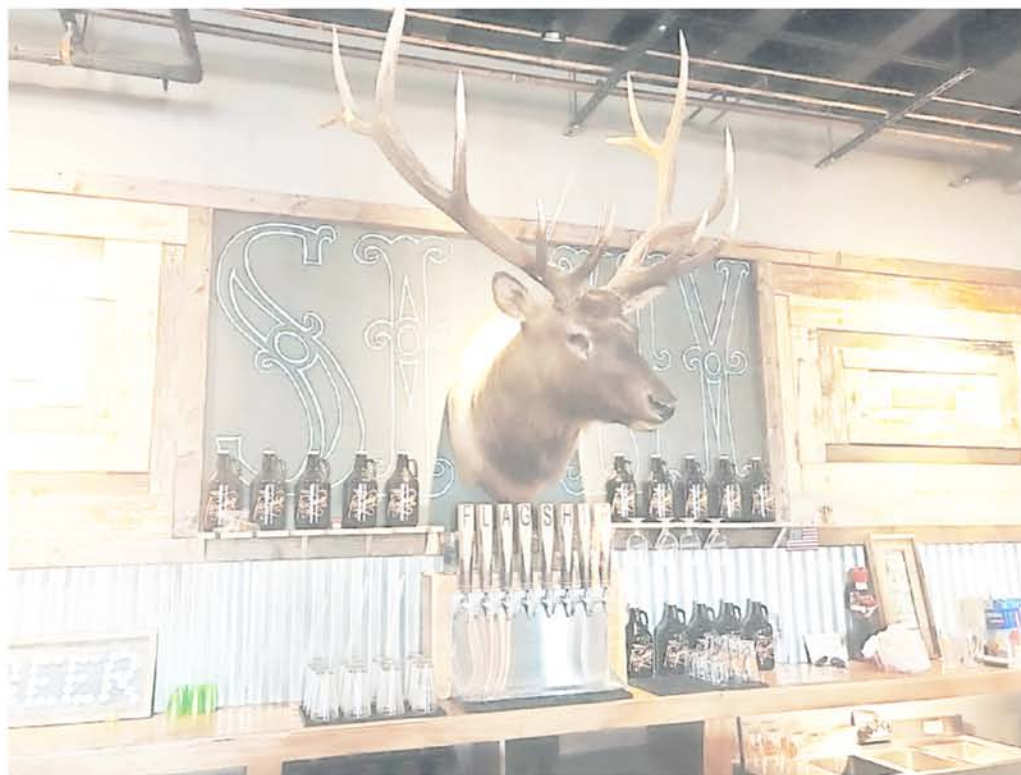
