Deep in debt? Get free legal help

Joint venture offers a helping hand to Islanders facing collection lawsuits

Staten Islanders facing debt collection lawsuits have a new defense: Free legal advice.

Those who can't afford an attorney can tap into the Staten Island Civil Legal Advice and Resource Office (CLARO), a joint effort be-

tween the Richmond County Bar Association, the Staten Island Women's Bar Association and Wagner College.

CLARO will be open on Thursdays from 5 to 7 p.m. in Room 300 of Richmond County Supreme Court, beginning Jan. 20.

"Facing a debt collection lawsuit can be overwhelming," said Patricia Anne Taylor, president of the Staten Island Women's Bar Associa-

of a lawsuit after creditors have taken other action such as garnishing wages or freezing bank accounts in order to secure a debt. CLARO will provide critical legal assistance to unrepresented debtors."

Last year, creditors in Richmond County filed 15,-269 consumer credit cases in New York Civil Court, according to the New York State Unified Court System.

Only 1 percent of the defendants had attorneys representing them.
