Wagner's 'Goddess Wheel' a Galt-y pleasure, sans sex

Athenians let their 'Hair' down as comedy breaks into hip hop at production in Snug Harbor Music Hall

Good news: "Goddess Wheel," a new **Galt Mac-**Dermot show with book/lyrics by Matty Selman, has another week to go, tomorrow through Sunday.

Try to catch this gleaming Wagner College production, off campus at the Music Hall, Snug Harbor Cultural Center. It's a work in progress, rough and young, beautiful and innocent, a little long and a little short, simultaneously. It's an opera masquerading as a musical, and

an embarrassment of riches. The first act alone has 15 songs, performed by a cast of 45 actor/singer/dancers aged 18 to 21. James Higgins directs a terrific bass/drums/ brass/sax band in the pit and director/choreographer Rusty Curcio not only moves things along, he fills the earthly plane — a wide, white cantilevered disc with wings (designed by Phil Hickox and Vicki Neal) with movement, shenanigans

and action. There are engaging effects and projections, deft lighting and mildly risqué costumes that play peek-a-boo with clear vinyl panels a la "Barbarella." It's "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum," not "Spartacus."

The material is ancient but

evergreen, as Matty Selman points out in the program. His crazy-complicated book is drawn from the foolproof sex-strike premise devised by Aristophanes in his 431 B.C comedy "Lysistrata."

The title character, a wily madam who runs a popular Athenian bordello, is fed up with the 30-year Peloponne-sian War. All the other wives and inamoratas in Athens are liked-minded, although they don't really get organized until nearly the end of the first act.

Their best allies turn out to be the mischievous goddesses of Olympus, who spend much of the show kibitzing high above the stage.

A strategy develops: If the men can't be reasoned with, then maybe deprivation and cold nights will move them. The women whip out their best weapon. They declare a boycott on lovemaking until peace breaks out.

ROCK, FUNK, AFRO-CARIBBEAN

Like MacDermot's "Hair" and "The Human Comedy," the "Goddess Wheel" has a war in the wings, only this time, it generates far more hilarity than tears.

Fans of the composer, who

has lived in Silver Lake for many years, will recognize his signature, rhythm-driven rock/funk style in "Goddess Wheel,"punctuated now and again with African and Caribbean motifs.

MacDermot imposes beautiful (and tricky-to-sing) songlines against the instrumentation. Everyone in the gifted cast hit their marks on aturday afternoon.

Danielle Dallacco's steely and beautiful Lysis-trata was riveting, whether she was on the ramparts or baring her soul. It's a pleasure to see a well-equipped young singer take such good care of the music.

Similarly, her comrade in arms, Kalonike (**Danielle** Jones), rocks the Acropolis when she wraps her fullbodied contralto around a hot number called "Weather." Afrodite, played by the excellent **Heather** Kirschenbauer (in a honeyequally lush shakedown called "Land for Peace."

The show jumps, marches, dashes and shimmies. The roots of hip-hop dance are in ancient Athens, it turns out. The choreographer found them there and excavated

them for his witty "Alpha-Beta"dance number.

SMART CHOICES

He made smart choices throughout the production. The book begins clearly but grows complicated and murky. A ghoulish oracle, played by **John Jamiel**, surfaces a couple times; it's not exactly clear why.

Rumbustious Spartans (suavely impersonated by Wagner athletes) arrive and make chumps out of the puny Athenians. They were funny, but it was odd.

Male characters are scanty and they don't have much to do. When Matt Sydney (Maximus) finally gets to use his big voice well into the second act, it's a revelation.

And when the terrifically admirable Lysistrata threatens to go to pieces in "With-out You" a musical goodbye to Maximus, whom she loves, you don't buy it. A canny encolored Afro) fronted an trepreneur who chilled out every bed in ancient Greece doesn't disintegrate so readily. Of course, the bottom line here is no surprise: Even love (or the lack thereof) can't end war.
