Open to all Tenured, Tenure Track, Associated and Adjunct Faculty

What it is:

You are encouraged to apply to participate in the 2020-2021 Scholarship Circle, a year-long research and writing group. Past participants report an increase in the likelihood of completing projects and articles leading to publication. They highlight the benefits of goal-setting, team support, resource and technical support, and writing retreats.

How it works:

Members of the Scholarship Circles meet for 60-90 minutes to advance their research, writing and projects through discussion, problem solving and the sharing of ideas. Membership in an interdisciplinary community of scholars helps to keep projects on track, as the SC members work autonomously throughout the year. Librarians serve as consultants to the Scholarship Circle. The meeting will be held, via Zoom, on Thursday, October 14, 2020 at 12:30 pm.

Whom it helps:

Dr. Christopher Corbo, Associate Professor, Biology Department and Faculty Grant Coordinator, will facilitate one of the Scholarship Circles and the Provost will facilitate the second Scholarship Circle. The time for the meetings will be established in accordance with the schedule that is convenient for those with accepted proposals.

Up to 12 faculty will be accepted for this academic year's Scholarship Circle.
