structure, function and role of carbohydrates, proteins, lipids, vitamins and trace elements in humans and bacteria. Finally, it looks at the immunological aspects of nutrition across the human life span compared to the immunological aspects in disease prevention.

Two-Unit ILC: Disability in Society and the Arts — SW 291-IL or MU 291-IL

This ILC will explore the range of human experiences with disability and how this intersects with society and the arts. We will examine embodied experiences across a range of disabilities (including those who may be gifted or have learning, mental, physical, or severe disabilities), and how these inform societal connotations as well as artistic disciplines spanning dance, drama, music, literature, visual art, and interdisciplinary mediums. Particular attention will be to responses to ableism, including beliefs and attitudes, as well as contemporary issues with particular emphasis on normalization, integration, community living, and how artistic work grounded in disability defies normativity. Additionally, access as an artistic aesthetic will be centered; focusing on access options across sensory outputs ranging visual, aural, and tactile mediums. As a two-course ILC, students will enroll in both SW291 and MU291. Our collective work will be to meet a few times together to engage in discussions and complete a final research project on students' chosen interdisciplinary topics
